Theme-based Tourist Circuits are circuits around specific themes such as religion, culture, ethnicity, niche, etc. A theme-based circuit can be confined to a state or can also be a regional circuit covering more than one state or Union territory.

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Box-10: Ten Key Features of Foreign Trade Policy-2015-20

Feature-1	FTP 2015-20 introduces two new schemes, namely 'Merchandise Exports from India Scheme (MEIS)' for export of specified goods to specified markets and 'Services Exports from India Scheme (SEIS)' for increasing exports of notified services.
Feature-2	Duty credit scrips issued under MEIS and SEIS and the goods imported against these scrips are fully transferable.
Feature-3	For grant of rewards under MEIS, the countries have been categorized into 3 Groups, whereas the rates of rewards under MEIS range from 2 per cent to 5 per cent.
Feature-4	Under SEIS the selected Services would be rewarded at the rates of 3 per cent and 5 per cent.
Feature-5	Measures have been adopted to nudge procurement of capital goods from indigenous manufacturers under the EPCG scheme by reducing specific export obligation to 75 per cent of the normal export obligation.
Feature-6	Measures have been taken to give a boost to exports of defense and hi-tech items.
Feature-7	E-Commerce exports of handloom products, books/periodicals, leather footwear, toys and customised fashion garments through courier or foreign post office would also be able to get benefit of MEIS (for values up to INR 25,000)
Feature-8	Manufacturers, who are also status holders, will now be able to self-certify their manufactured goods in phases, as originating from India with a view to qualifying for preferential treatment under various forms of bilateral and regional trade agreements. This 'Approved Exporter System' will help manufacturer exporters considerably in getting fast access to international markets.
Feature-9	A number of steps have been taken for encouraging manufacturing and exports under 100 per cent EOU/EHTP/STPI/BTP Schemes. The steps include a fast track clearance facility for these units, permitting them to share infrastructure facilities, permitting inter unit transfer of goods and services, permitting them to set up warehouses near the port of export and to use duty free equipment for training purposes.
Feature-10	108 MSME clusters have been identified for focused interventions to boost exports. Accordingly, 'Niryat Bandhu Scheme' has been galvanised and repositioned to achieve the objectives of 'Skill India'.

India is a member of Universal Postal Union since 1876.
To commemorate 150 th birth anniversary of Gandhi, in August 2020, around 87 postal administrations released stamps.
Rafi Ahmed Kidwai National Postal Academy (RAKNPA) at Ghaziabad is the apex-training institute of the Department recognized by the DoPT as a Central Training Institute for higher managerial cadres.
Indian Post Office Rules 2019 are to be issued which will be in supersession of IPO Rules, 1933. The Indian Post Office Rules, 2019, will be a new set of rules, which will govern the functioning of the post offices in the present environment. These will enable better administration of the postal services leading to increased customer satisfaction.
National Policy on Universal Electronic Accessibility (2013) was formulated to break the barriers faced by differently abled persons by ensuring easy accessibility of electronics and ICT.
National Knowledge Network (NKN) was established in 2010 and facilitates Digital India, as it is the backbone for all e-Governance initiatives in the country.
National Informatics Centre (NIC) set up National Informatics Centre Services Inc. (NICSIS) in 1995 as its extended arm for providing total ICT solutions to the central and state government departments and organisations.
Vikaspedia is an initiative for providing e-knowledge and using ICT based applications for empowerment of poor (rural and urban). It seeks to maximise utility of ongoing government programmes through the provision of universally accessible digital information resources in Indian languages, created and shared collaboratively by various development stakeholders.

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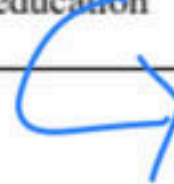

(ISPRL), has set up Strategic Petroleum Reserves (SPR) at three locations with a capacity of 5.33 MMT located at Visakhapatnam, Mangalore and Padur. The crude oil stored can be used in emergency situations. These three SPRs can meet approximately 9.5 days of national demand. Ministry is also exploring possibility to lease SPRs outside India and USA is one of the options being considered. This will increase the country's strategic oil stockpile and boost India's energy security.
